



Advanced Placement Examinations Summary of Credit and Placement

The School of Industrial and Labor Relations has the following policy regarding College Board Advance Placement credits. A maximum of 30 credits can be accepted either for approved required courses in the ILR curriculum or as General Elective Credit (GEC). The following guidelines **govern use of AP credits to meet ILR requirements**. The balance of AP courses would go towards General Electives Credit and can be used to fulfill degree requirements.

Credit distributions:

| English Language & Composition or English Literature & Composition | 4,5 | 3 | Either AP Literature or Language may be used to fulfill one of the First Year Writing Seminar requirements. If you have two English AP courses, the second will be allocated to GEC |
| Environmental Science * | 4,5 | 3 | Can be used to fulfill science requirement as Earth & Atmospheric Science 101 or 111 and Natural Resources 201 or GEC |
| Government and Politics, U.S. | 4,5 | 3 GEC | Placement out of Government 111 (can not be used for Cultural Perspectives or |

*only one AP course may be used to fulfill required courses in Cultural Perspectives (3 credits), Western Intellectual Tradition (3 credits), or Science (3 credits)

GEC= General Elective Credit. AP Language courses may be used to fulfill upper division ILR requirements. See CU Courses of Study, pages 8-9.

note: The ILR faculty believes that full-time study for a defined period best promotes intellectual development and best prepares students for citizenship and careers. Consequently, undergraduates must complete eight semesters of full-time study, including work done while on an approved credit internship or study abroad program, in order to meet their degree requirements. Those who enter the school as transfer students will be required to complete four to six semesters in full-time residence, depending on the number of full-time semesters completed at another institution.
