Christine Ahn is the Economic and Social Human Rights Program Coordinator at Food First/Institute for Food and Development Policy. Christine writes and speaks frequently on human rights, poverty, hunger, trade, globalization, North Korea, and philanthropy. She has worked with grassroots organizations in Denver, CO and Washington, DC; on the Navajo Reservation and the U.S.-Mexico border; and in Kingston, Jamaica.
