Francine Moccio holds a Ph.D. from the Graduate Faculty, New School for Social Research in Cultural Anthropology and Political Economy. She is currently the Director of the Institute for Women and Work at Cornell University's School of Industrial and Labor Relations. Prior to coming to Cornell, Francine was Assistant Professor and Director of Working Women's Studies Program at the State University of New York, Empire State College. Francine has conducted training on such issues as sexual harassment, gender equity, and public policy for agencies such as the New York State Assembly and Senate, the New Jersey Senate, and the Women's Congressional Caucus. She has also appeared as an expert on women and work on network shows such as "Inside Albany," Sunday Nightly News (Channel 4), CNN and C-SPAN, as well as radio shows such as WABC, WOR, and the National Public Radio. She has been quoted in several newspapers and magazines including *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *The Boston Globe*, *Vogue Magazine*, and *Newsweek*. Currently, she is a Task Force Member of the National Women's Coalition for Labor Reform based in Washington D.C., and has repeatedly testified at congressional briefings and before the Dunlop Commission on the Future of Worker-Management Relations on the importance of labor law reform and organizing women into unions.
