

Ileen DeVault

Ileen DeVault is Associate Professor of Collective Bargaining, Labor Law, and Labor History in the School of Industrial and Relations at Cornell University, where she has taught labor history since 1986. She also serves as a Core Faculty member of Cornell's Feminist, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program, and served as that program's Associate and then Acting Director in the mid-1990s, when it was known as Women's Studies. Before coming to Cornell, Dr. DeVault, who holds a doctorate in History from Yale University, was an associate editor of the Samuel Gompers Papers. She has written two book, Sons and Daughters of Labor: Class and Clerical Work in Turn-of-the-Century Pittsburgh (Cornell University Press, 1990), and United Apart: Sex, Gender, and the Rise of Craft Unionism, 1887-1903 (Cornell University Press, forthcoming, 2004), as well as numerous articles and book reviews. During the academic year 2000/2001, Dr. DeVault held a fellowship at The New York Public Library's Center for Scholars and Writers. She has spoken widely at professional conferences and public events on topics of gender, sex segregation, and unions.
