Shelley Feldman is Associate Professor, Development Sociology and former Director of the South Asia and the Gender and Global Change programs at Cornell University. She is co-editor of *Unequal Burden: Economic Crises, Persistent Poverty, and Women's Work* (1992), Boulder: Westview and of *Informal Work and Social Change* (1998), Ithaca: Cornell University Press. Her articles include: "Feminist Interruptions: The Silence of the East Bengal Voice in the Story of Partition," "(Re)presenting Islam: Manipulating Gender, Shifting State Practices and Class Frustrations," "Exploring Theories of Patriarchy: A Perspective from Contemporary Bangladesh," as well as "NGOs and Civil Society: (Un)stated Contradictions," and "Paradoxes of Institutionalization: The Depoliticisation of Bangladeshi NGOs". Her current research offers an institutional history of the post-1947 period national period in East Pakistan, and a second project on displacement. She lived in Bangladesh from 1977-1984 and continues to undertake research there.
