Youngju Seo is from South Korea. As a researcher and an activist, she has actively participated in the labor and women's movement in South Korea since 1992. She worked for the "Workers' Institute for Management Analysis" for nine years, and worked with the Korean Confederation of Trade Unions, and various women's trade unions and organizations. She is co-author of three books: *The Reduction of Working Hours and Trade Union's Policy (1999)*; *A Model Agreement for Women-friendly Work Environment (2000)*; and *Contingent Workers and Trade Union (2001)*.

She is a graduate student in the Department of Regional Economic and Social Development at the University of Massachusetts Lowell and the recipient of a prestigious Solomont Scholarship. She has worked for the Center for Women and Work, and the Gender and Development Group since 2001. Her present research interests are gender and development issues. She is completing her thesis, "Industrialization and Women Workers in South Korea: 1960-2003".
