

Labor Leadership Skills Certificate

The **Cornell Labor Leadership Skills training** is designed for current and future union officers and staff. This skills building certificate encourages interaction and participation to improve union leadership skills. Participants completing 6 different workshops receive a certificate. On-line workshops are based on 10 total hours, about three hours each week. Participants are expected to check online about 3 times per week. These skills based workshops help deepen the knowledge needed to build and re-build strong and effective organizations.

This tools-building workshop emphasizes the rights of stewards/committee persons in resolving disputes in the workplace. The right to information, duty of fair representation, and members Weingarten rights will be covered. Participants will learn how to protect the grievance process, equality principle, seven tests of just cause and how to simplify grievance writing.
