

ILR Summary of Credit Policies

The following guidelines govern use of AP credits to meet ILR requirements. Semester Credit Limit

Students shall not exceed 18 credits in a semester except for PE, ROTC requirements, a required pre or post course for an ILR-approved experiential learning opportunity, or in the final semester before graduation. Students cannot petition to exceed 18 credits when none of these conditions are present.

Transfer Credit Limitations

Before matriculation, students who enter ILR as first-year students can apply a maximum of 15 transfer credits taken outside Cornell University, including up to 12 AP, IB and other test credits. This includes approved dual enrollment credit.

Once first-year and transfer students matriculate, all students are limited to a total of 15 extramural credits throughout the course of their degree. Extramural credits include credits taken during the summer or winter session at another institution. These limitations do not apply to approved study-abroad programs. Total transfer credit cannot exceed 60 credits, including test credits.

DUAL ENROLLMENT CREDIT: Some applicants to Cornell take college courses during high school. Non-Cornell credit may be accepted when:

- the credits are earned at an accredited institution
- the course is taken on a college/university campus or online with matriculated college students and is taught by a college/university professor
- the credits have not been applied toward high school graduation requirements
- an email from a HS counselor is sent to ilradmissions@cornell.edu confirming that the course meets the above criteria (this should be sent after a student decides to enroll at Cornell, but before they begin taking classes)
- the grade earned is “C” or better
